

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING  
BETWEEN  
SKILL COUNCIL FOR GREEN JOBS  
&  
National Solid Waste Management Association of India**

This Memorandum of Understanding is signed on

3<sup>rd</sup> June, 2016 between

The Skill Council for Green Jobs, a registered society and sector skill council of National Skill Development Corporation, Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, with its office situated at 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor, Plot No. 4, Institutional Area, CBIP Building, Malcha Marg, Chanakyapuri, New Delhi – 110 021 (hereinafter SCGJ which expression shall include its successors and permitted assignees).

And

The National Solid Waste Management Association of India, with its office at AJ Riverview 33/34, Shamsundar Society, Near Mhatre Bridge, Pune- 411030, (hereinafter NSWAI which expression shall include its successors and permitted assignees).

**Recognizing** that the Government of India has announced the National Policy for Skill Development and Entrepreneurship 2015 and Skill India Mission. It envisages a major role of private sector as shared responsibility for skill development in the country. The Government of India is implementing Skill India Mission, and the Make in India Mission.

**Welcoming** that SCGJ acts as a bridge between the Government of India, State Governments and industry for developing strategy & implementing programmes for Skills Development, correlated to Industry needs and also aligned to best International practices.

**Noting** that the SCGJ scope covers the entire gamut of "Green Businesses", viz Renewable Energy including Wind Energy, Green Construction, Green Transport, Carbon Sinks, Solid Waste Management, Water Management & e-Waste Management, hence would have pan India impact.



**Acknowledging** that the Skill Council for Green Jobs is focusing on understanding and capturing the skill needs for both service users and service providers within the sector and will work on a road-map for a nation-wide, industry led collaborative skills initiative.

**Emphasizing** that the Skill Council for Green Jobs is in the process of identifying the skill gaps in the Wind Energy sector in manufacturing, business development and installation & maintenance. The purpose is to identify manpower requirement for the industry and the type of skill and training they require.

**Recognizing** that National Solid Waste Association of India (NSWAI) is the only leading professional non-profit organization in the field of Solid Waste Management in India. With over 500 members worldwide, NSWAI comprises of a strong member team of national and international experts on waste management.

**Noting** that the Skill council for Green Jobs has been in touch with M/s National Solid Waste Association of India (NSWAI) and principally agreed to collaborate for solid waste management related skill development programs.

**Conceding** that NSWAI recognizes that there is a need of trained man power in solid waste management sector in India. It is prerequisite to systematically address this requirement for an orderly growth of the sector.

Therefore, both the organizations have come to the following understanding:

## OBJECTIVES

Both the organizations, through this Memorandum of Understanding, intend to work together towards providing a better informed and skilled manpower to the solid waste management sector through a systematic approach by launching various studies to understand requirement of the sector and strengthen skilling process, align them to international standards as per the requirement of the solid waste management and the National Skills Qualification Framework.



## Focus Areas of Co-operation

### 1. Occupational Mapping of the solid waste management sector in India

The Skill Council for Green Jobs would undertake the work of Occupational Mapping of the solid waste management sector in India. This would cover all sub activities in the solid waste management sector including all kinds of waste such as municipal solid waste, bio – medical waste, hazardous waste, e-waste and construction & demolition waste. NSWAI, would help the council in validating its findings in this regard so that national occupational standards could be developed for the job roles identified.

### 2. Development of National Occupational Standards in the solid waste management sector

The Skill Council for Green Jobs would undertake development of National Occupational Standards as per the requirement of solid waste management sector. National Solid Waste Management Association of India, would help the council in making these standards as per international Standards there by working for the National cause of 'Skill India'.

### 3. Building technical contents

National Solid Waste Management Association of India, would help the Skill Council for Green Jobs in developing suitable training programmes around the NOSs. This would help in grooming manpower as per the requirement of the Industry and thereby improving their employability to work in the specialized technical areas

### 4. Confidentiality:

Neither of the parties will place in public domain, information generated during effective period of this MOU without consulting the other party, unless the information,

- 1) is already available in public domain
- 2) is independently developed by the receiving party; or,
- 3) is required to be disclosed by law or court order.

While placing the information in the public domain the role of the other party will be duly recognized and acknowledged.

5. **Termination:** Either of the party is entitled to terminate this Agreement by giving the other party a 30 days' notice. Expenditure incurred by the receiving party pursuant to the objectives of the Agreement will however not be refunded.
